Our Top Tips for Measuring

Even if you have no DIY or measuring experience, don't worry – measuring is easy, especially for our skylight blinds! Keep your tape measure handy just in case, but you shouldn't actually need it, as skylight windows feature a code plate with a size code printed on it.

If you do have to do any measuring then here are some general tips to keep in mind:

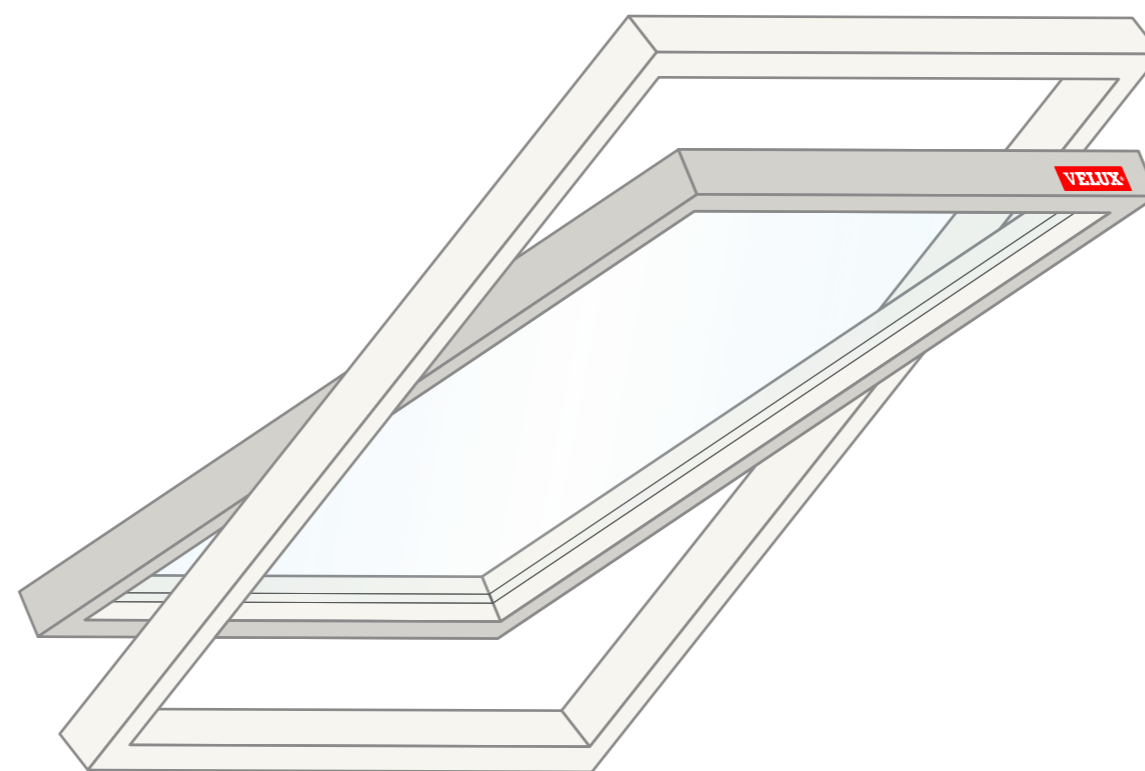
- ✓ Always use a metal tape measure – cloth or plastic ones can stretch, giving you inaccurate measurements
- ✓ Double check everything! If you're even slightly unsure about a measurement you've taken, measure again until you're certain
- ✓ Measure to the nearest millimetre, or to the nearest fraction if you're measuring in inches

Find Your Window's Code Plate

What is a *code plate*?

Skylight windows are made in a limited range of preset sizes. An identification plate is fixed to the frame, which contains information about the window's size and specifications. The size of that window is identified using a simple alpha-numeric code.

- ✓ Look around the window frame to find the code plate
- ✗ Do not measure the window frame to try to find your size – if you can't find your code plate then check out our Top Tips page



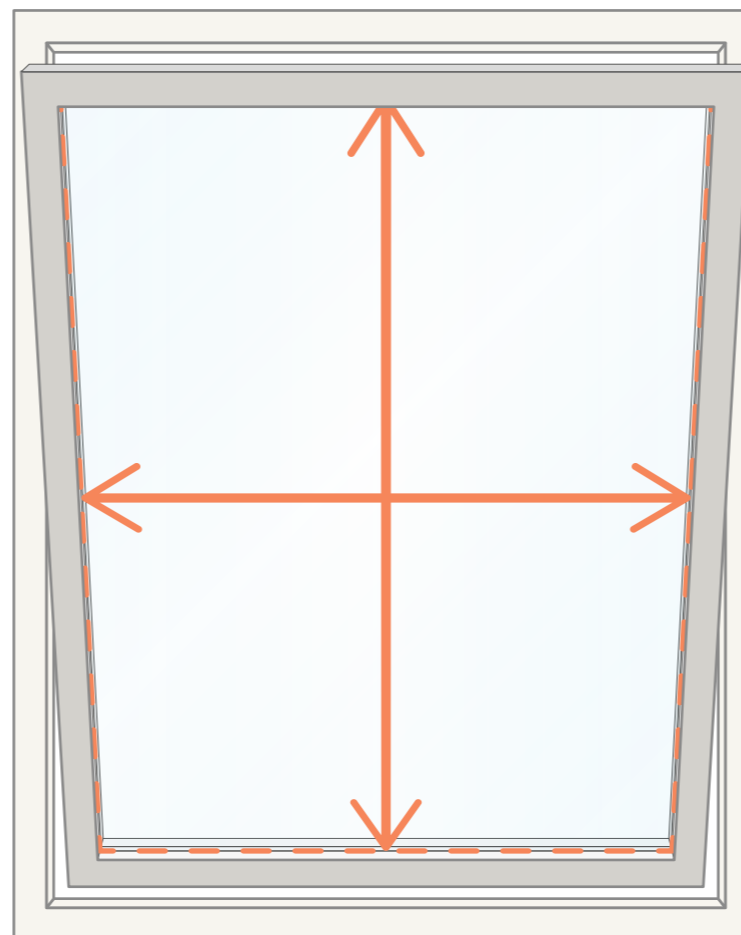
Find the code plate

The code plate is attached to the frame, usually on the opening part of the frame.

- i The code plate contains quite a bit of information, but you only need the size code. *Here's an example to help you identify the part of the code you need:*

If you can't find your window's code plate

Don't worry, getting the correct size is still easy, you just need to dust off that tape measure. Measure the full width and drop of the visible glass – not including any part of the frame – and give our customer service team a call. We'll be able to identify the correct size from the glass measurements.
